

# Export a Clipchamp Video and Share with OneDrive/Stream

## Faculty Resource

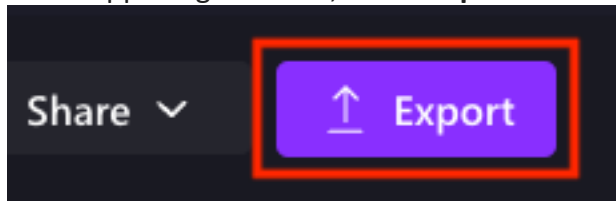
This document provides steps for exporting a video from Clipchamp and then sharing with OneDrive/Stream.

*Note: Many sharing options are available. Do whatever works best with your preferred workflow. If YouTube is your video sharing platform preference, simply download your exported video and then upload to YouTube.*

Once all video editing is done, follow these steps to export and share the video.

## Step 1 – Select Export

In the upper-right corner, select **Export**.



## Step 2 – Set Export Settings

Most of the default settings can be left:

**Quality:** 1080p – High quality (recommended)

**Save in the cloud:** ensure this is enabled if you plan on sharing in OneDrive/Stream (or disable this setting if you plan on sharing with a different video sharing platform such as YouTube)

**OneDrive:** The exported video will be saved to a default location in your OneDrive account in folders titled Videos > Clipchamp. You can change this by selecting “Change location”.

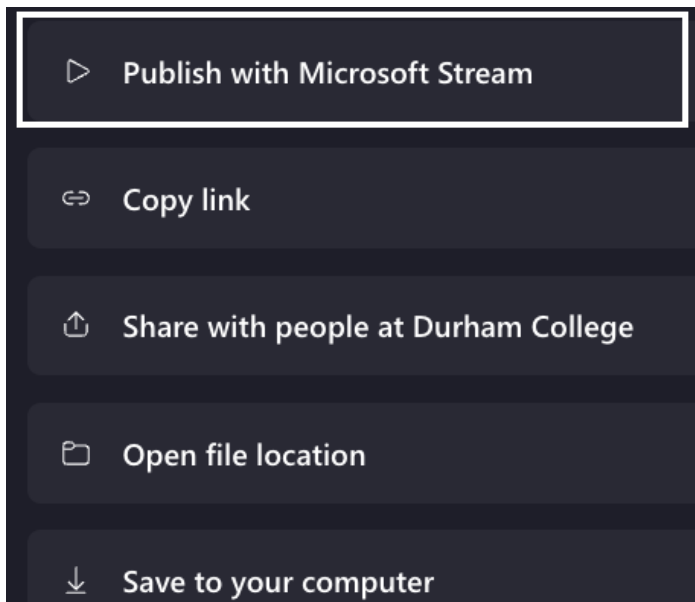

## Step 3 – Share or Download Video from Clipchamp

After the video is exported, choose a sharing option.

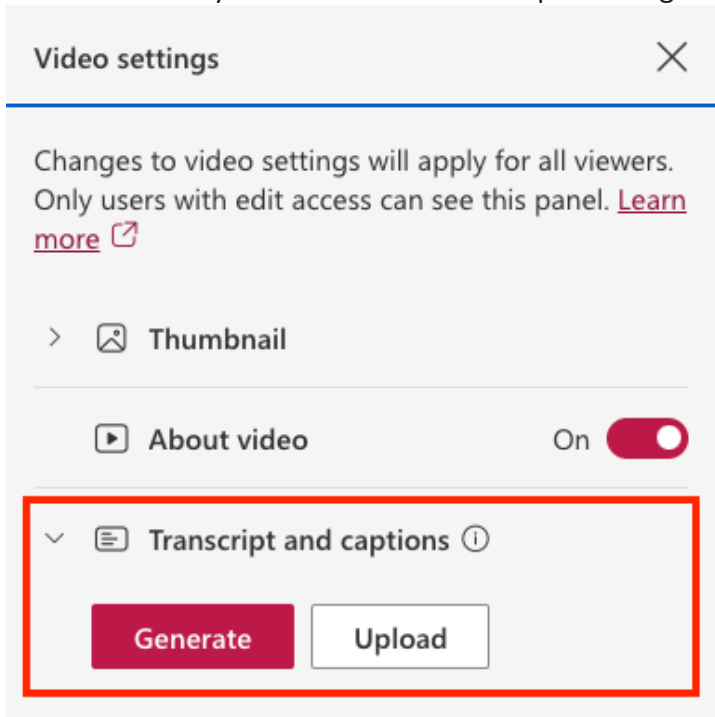
**Publish with Microsoft Stream** is probably the most direct option to select. This will open the video (that is being stored in OneDrive) with Microsoft Stream so you can access the video settings and ensure captions are generated.

*Note: If you plan on sharing with YouTube, select “Save to your computer” instead.*



## Step 4 – Generate Captions

In the **Video settings** on the right-side, expand the **Transcript and captions** section and select **Generate**. It may take a bit of time for captions to generate.



**TIP:** If video settings aren't displayed on the right-side of your screen, confirm that you are in "Editing" mode and not "Viewing" mode.



## Step 5 – Share from Microsoft Stream

Videos can be shared in a similar way as other OneDrive files.

Select **Share**, in the upper-right corner.



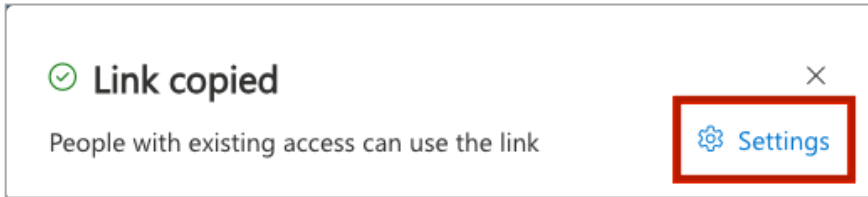
There are a few different sharing options. Below are instructions for sharing with a link and with embed code.

### Share with a link:

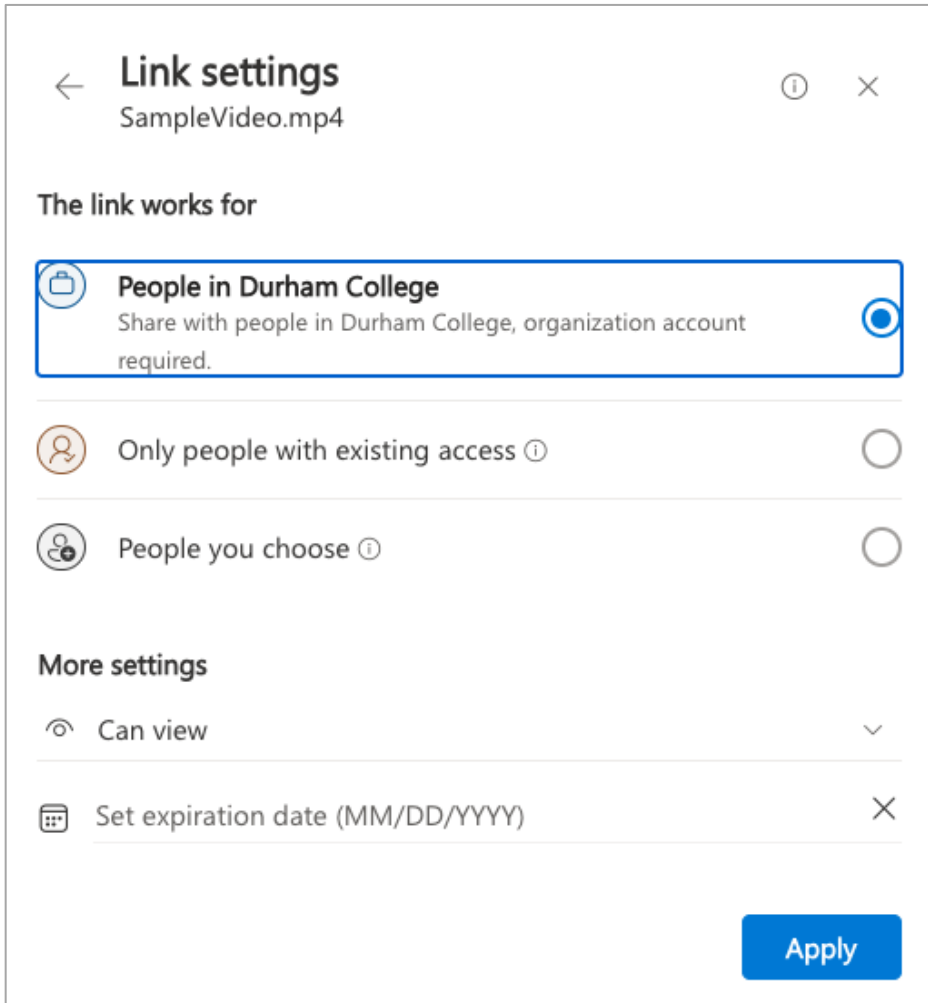
Select **Copy link**.



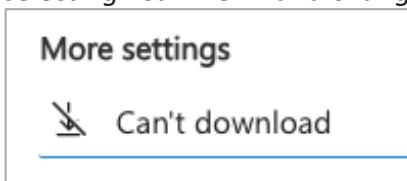
Select **Settings**.



Select **"People in Durham College"**, then **Apply**.



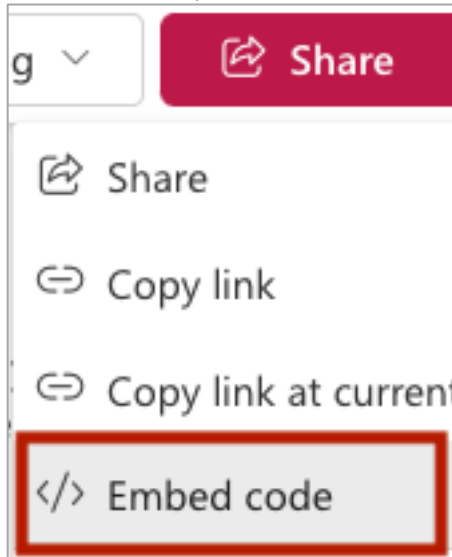
*Note: You can disable the option for students to download your video in the step above by selecting "Can view" and changing the drop-down selection to "Can't download".*



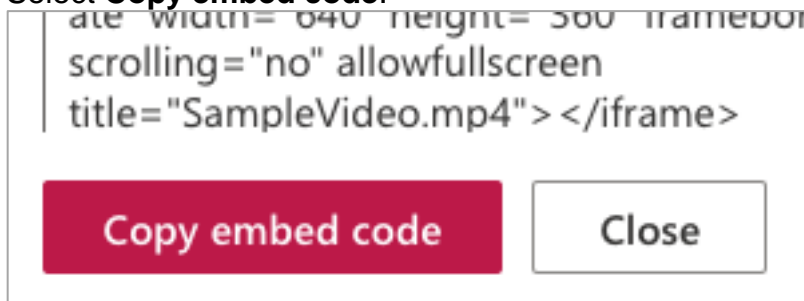
After selecting **Apply**, the link has been copied and is ready to be pasted in DC Connect the same way you share any other link with your students.

**Share with Embed Code:**

Select **Share**, then **Embed code**.

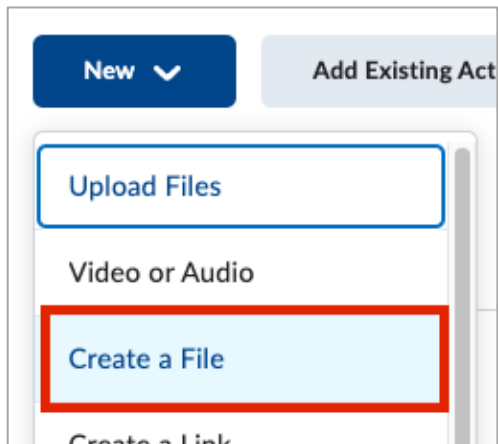


Select **Copy embed code**.



The embed code has now been copied and is ready to be added in DC Connect. Follow these steps to add embed code in DC Connect:

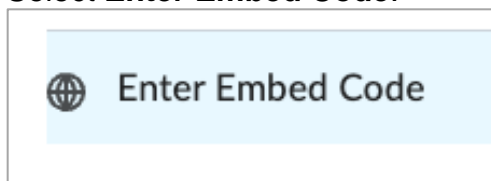
Within a content module select **New > Create a File**.



Enter a title for the page and then select **Insert stuff**.



Select **Enter Embed Code**.



Paste the embed code (previously copied from Stream) by using **Ctrl + V** (Cmd + V for Mac) or right-click and Paste.

Select **Next**, then **Insert**.

Then **Save and Close**.
