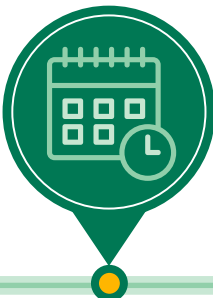

## TYPES OF EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING AT DC

CO-OPERATIVE EDUCATION	Paid work experience that counts as an academic credit but occurs outside of the academic term.
FIELD PLACEMENT	On-the-job experience, typically unpaid, which usually occurs during the academic year.
PRACTICUM	Supervised, unpaid on-site work experience.
APPLIED RESEARCH	Research projects carried out by students and faculty experts.
CAPSTONE PROJECT	A multi-faceted assignment that challenges students to apply all of the knowledge and skills they've acquired throughout their studies.
SERVICE LEARNING	A means to connect with community and industry, test skills in your chosen field and gain real-work experience.

## OPTIONS TO FIT YOUR NEEDS

### CERTIFICATES (ONE YEAR)

These two- and three-semester programs allow graduates to seek employment in their field of study or continue their education into a diploma, advanced diploma or degree program.

### DIPLOMAS (TWO YEARS)

Through four semesters of study, students will be prepared for the workforce or further study in a graduate certificate or degree program. Some programs have a work term at the end of first or second year.

### ADVANCED DIPLOMAS (THREE YEARS)

These six-semester programs offer specialized training that prepares students for the workforce or further study in a graduate certificate or degree program. Some programs have a work term at the end of first or second year.

### BACHELOR DEGREE (THREE YEARS)

Six-semester bachelor degree programs combine academic theory with applied learning to prepare you for real-world careers. Build a strong foundation of knowledge and skills in a focused format.

### HONOURS BACHELOR DEGREES (FOUR YEARS)

Eight- and nine-semester honours degree programs offer a solid foundation of theoretical knowledge and hands-on, practical skills that can be applied in the real world.

### GRADUATE CERTIFICATES (ONE YEAR)

These two- and three-semester programs require a university or college credential and/or specific experience for admission, and provide students the opportunity to deepen their knowledge and further hone their skills to expand their career opportunities.

### DC'S HUB FOR FOOD AND HOSPITALITY

The W. Galen Weston Centre is a community destination where students learn through curriculum, hands-on labs, community engagement and real-world experiences. It follows the field-to-fork concept, which is based on the harvesting, storage, processing, packaging, sale, and consumption of food.

The Barrett Centre of Innovation in Sustainable Urban Agriculture, an extension of our operations and programs, is a hub of excellence in urban agricultural practices, research, education, and training, addressing some of society's biggest challenges including food insecurity, access to safe and stable supplies of fresh food, and economic stability and regeneration of land for local food production.

Students have countless opportunities to extend their learning through paid and volunteer positions in the Weston Centre's award-winning, full-service restaurant Bistro '67 and the Pantry retail store, as well as the urban farms.

### EMBRACING DC GREEN IN THE AGRICULTURAL FIELDS AND HYDROPONIC VERTICAL FARM

**Horticulture – Food and Farming** students at the Weston Centre play a lead role in growing upwards of 3,000 kilograms of food each year to be used in post-secondary operations, Bistro '67 and Pantry. It's also home to the community-supported agricultural program. An on-site composting facility with a biodigester processes lab food and field waste making our site field-to-fork-to-field.

A hydroponic vertical farm, built inside a repurposed shipping container allows the Centre to grow up to 700 heads of lettuce a week, all year round. We also feature aquaponics, grow walls and microgreen production, a pollinator garden, an apiary and, new in fall 2025, mushroom propagation.

### THE FUTURE IS ELECTRIC

The newly opened Vanhaverbeke Family EV Training Centre will help DC advance electric vehicle and sustainable technology in the sector through the new Electric Drive Vehicle Technician program. The EV Training Centre is part of a 9,060-square-foot expansion and revitalization of the main building at DC's Whitby campus. The centre educates motive power technicians on EVs with programs centred on hands-on, experiential learning.

### HANDS-ON LEARNING IN LABS AND SHOPS

Located at the Whitby campus, the 60,000 square foot Ontario Power Generation Centre for Skilled Trades and Technology (CSTT) is home to many specialized labs and shops that support student learning across numerous full-time post-secondary and apprenticeship programs.

In the Mobile Crane Simulator Lab, students begin to understand the types and configurations of cranes and the science of how they operate. The Motor Vehicle Shop is equipped with vehicles for students to learn disassembly and reassembly procedures and troubleshooting mechanical techniques. The campus also boasts shops for carpentry, welding, millwright, power engineering, plumbing, electrical, and the Vanhaverbeke Family EV Training Centre.

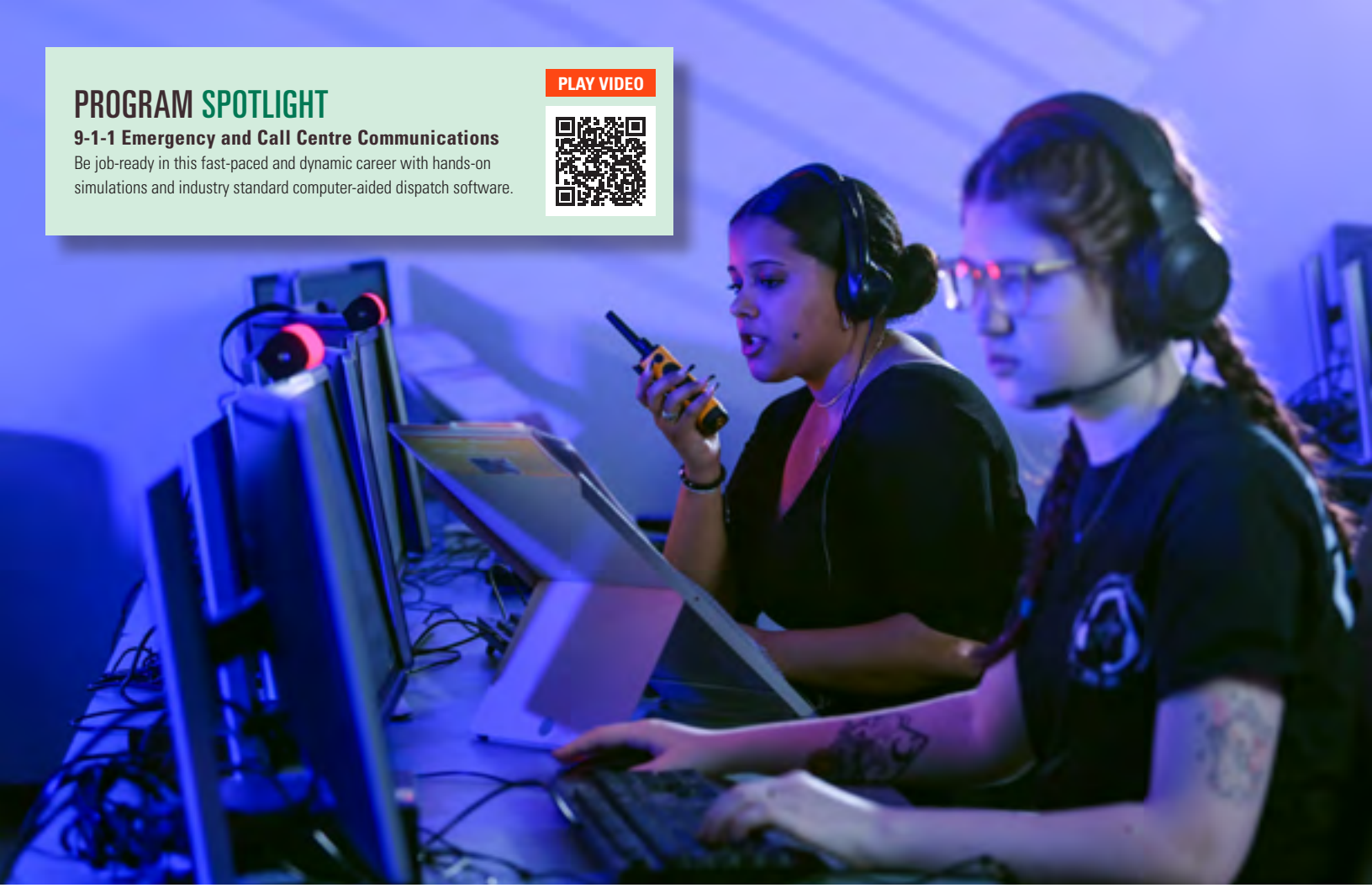
