Language of Instruction

English

English Language Requirements

Exchange students are not required to submit proof of their English proficiency. Partner institutions are expected to select students who have a good standard of English (minimum of Academic IELTS: 6.0 or equivalent).

Learning Agreement

One academic student advisor appointed by the dean of the academic faculty at DC works with each exchange student to complete the SA (Inbound) Learning Agreement.

STUDENT SUPPORT

Immigration

Students planning to study in Canada for one term (fewer than six months), may study under temporary resident status as a visitor. For any period longer than six months (two terms), a study permit is required.

Students from some countries may be required to hold a temporary resident visa (entry visa) to enter Canada. The temporary resident visa (if required) will automatically be issued as part of a successful study permit application.

Most students who do not require a vis require an electronic travel authorization (eTA) to enter Canada.
