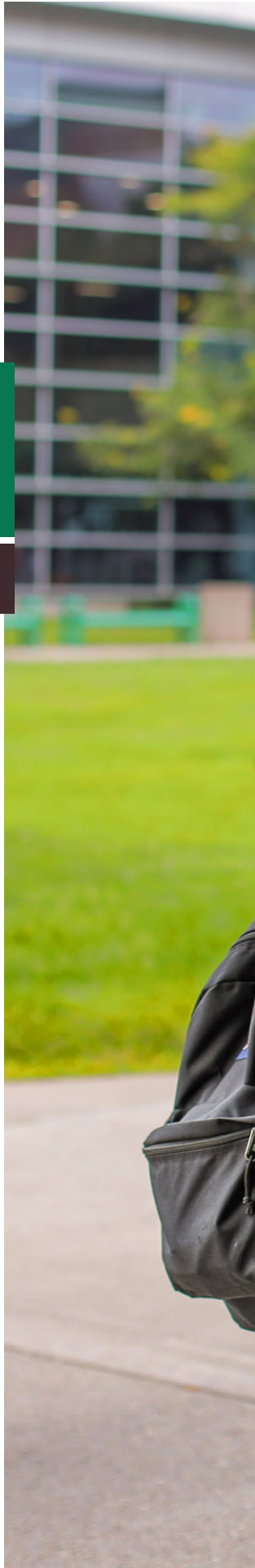

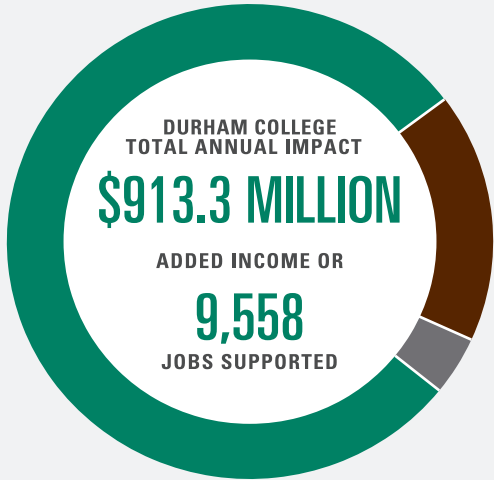

Strong enrolment means equipment needs to be replaced more frequently and rapid innovation requires a range of options from industry-standard to cutting-edge so graduates can be prepared for what they'll find in the workplace.
