MESSAGE FROM The Program Coordinator - Debbie Miller

The Court Support Services program was offered this past year in an alternate delivery mode. The pandemic seen many changes in delivery of programs across the college. Due to the changing public health guidelines respecting attendance at the college, this program was offered in a Hy-Flex delivery mode.

What is Hy-Flex delivery?

Hy-Flex delivery allows students to attend classes in a way that best fits their lifestyle and so they choose either to attend class in person on campus, attend class online and learn at the same time as those who are in the classroom or attend asynchronously by viewing the class recording and completing their own online tasks to enhance their learning. We truly believe that this alternate delivery style gave the Court Support Services the boost that it needed this year to run successfully during a difficult time for all!

Although students were not able to attend field placements, the feedback we received was very positive as students were able to observe live court proceedings each week via Zoom. They also were lucky to meet with presiding justices and counsel in break out rooms to further discuss what was happening in court that day. On days where students did not observe live court proceedings online, we were blessed to host Justice Devlin and Justice of the Peace Coopersmith from the Ontario Court of Justice. Students also had a much needed relaxing mindfulness session online with DC facilitator Andrea Leskowsky-Grupp. They ended the semester in this course by completing a one day "Conflict in the Workplace" workshop facilitated by graduate Alicia Klonowski.

Overall, the year went by quickly and the students were able to adapt very well to the Hy-Flex program. The faculty team is grateful to all of our 2021-22 students and for the resiliency and flexibility they contributed to the success of the program this year. 




Pathways for Court Support Services Students
