

# **Barbados – The Business of Sport**

Christ Church, Barbados November 25 to December 2, 2024

Application deadline: May 17, 2024

# **Project description:**

Third-Year students (as of September 2024) from two programs, Sport Management and Marketing, will come together to provide business consultation services for a local sport company in Barbados (Cat's International Sports).

Cat's International Sports is an organization dedicated to the growth and development of Sport and Sports tourism. Their experienced team offers development of athletic talents and skills, by providing a range of logistics and marketing services with links to a variety of clubs, colleges, and sporting. The CEO of this organization is a Durham College Alumni of the Sport Management program.

In supporting Cat's International Sports (CIS), students will be presented with a business challenge that CIS is facing and will volunteer as part of the Global Organic Tourism Master Plan tournament (a tournament that has a variety of sports, both water and land based for international teams in the Caribbean), that they are partnering with. By volunteering at the event, the students will get a perspective of how the event is currently marketed, executed and run and will be able to develop recommendations for next year's event. Students will research the current situation, develop recommendations, and present results to the executives.

# Program/learning/cultural highlights:

- Visits to cultural sites/events in Barbados such as: Bridgetown, Garrison and George Washington, Bajan, Oister Fish Market, and Barbados Independence Day Activities (All subject to change)
- Volunteering at an international sport event
- Consulting with a Sport Business, analyzing their business, and developing and presenting recommendations to their executives

### Accommodation and meals:

Accommodations will be double occupancy at local hotels. Students can expect to spend about \$1,400 on meals – however, some cheaper options may be available.

# **Student Support:**

DC students will be supported by DC faculty and International Education Office staff. Two faculty members from the Faculty of Business will accompany the successful candidates to Barbados.

# **Visa and Passports:**

Canadian students are not required to apply for a tourist visa for Barbados. Passports must be valid for six months after the return date. You must provide a copy of your passport by June 13. Students that do not hold Canadian Passports may be required to secure a visa at their own expense. Information is available <a href="here">here</a>. Be aware that flights may connect through countries other than Canada and Barbados.

#### Risks:

#### **Academics:**

Students will be required to submit course work related to this FLCA experience. Faculty will advise of those assignments prior to travel.

# Things to know:

- Students <u>must</u> attend pre-departure training.
- Students <u>must</u> follow the DC Student Code of Conduct throughout the duration of the program.
- Students are responsible for all associated pre-departure medical requirements, including vaccinations.

## **Program costs:**

Program cost will be discussed at the information session. An **estimate** of costs is as follows, but these are not final and subject to change:

- Hotel \$707 per student per week
- Meals \$1,400 per student per week
- Flight \$1,000 per student
- Local Transportation \$250 per student
- Cultural Excursions \$400 per student
- A non-refundable deposit of \$250 will be required upon acceptance.
- Total Estimated Trip Cost: \$3,757

NOTE on estimated Costs: Most of the estimated costs are conservative in nature. This means we strive for the actual total costs to be less than \$3,757.

# **Education Abroad Bursary:**

Students selected for an education abroad opportunity may be eligible for a travel bursary of up to \$1,500 CAD. - Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.0 (GPA will be confirmed prior to travel)
