Portfolio requirements

Please note, applicants with a senior-level visual arts or media arts credit on their high school transcript are **not** required to submit a portfolio.

Applicants without a senior-level visual arts or media arts credit are required to submit a portfolio of work to be considered for admission.

Portfolio Submission Guidelines

- 10-12 digital samples of your best work. Create a separate page for each piece and include the following: title, number, date created and your name. At the beginning of your digital file, create a summary page that lists the number, title and medium used to create the work.
- All work must be your own. Any plagiarized work will be disqualified.
- Assessment is based on creativity/originality, composition and craftsmanship.
- Submitted work should be a single, multi-page PDF file at a reasonable size [under 10mb].
- Work can be submitted to the following web address: [dcgd.ca/apply]
- You should submit work that covers a range of media including, but not limited to, painting, sculpture, photography, drawing, design.
