


# STUDENT CONDUCT & CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

At Durham College we are dedicated to fostering a respectful, professional learning environment to promote adult self regulation for our students. A student of concern is a student displaying signs of distressed, disruptive or threatening behaviours.



Behaviour that causes alarm or worry for a student's wellbeing.

Behaviour is NOT impacting the safety of the teaching & learning environment.

Behaviour that disrupts the learning environment or the customary respectful academic functioning in the college.

Behaviour is NOT impacting the safety of the teaching & learning environment.

Behaviour that causes concern for personal safety of an individual or the safety of others.

- Plagiarism
- Interruptions

# EMOTIONALLY DISTRESSEE BEHAVIOUR

- Emotional pain
- Tearfulness
- Interruptions

## **NEXT STEPS:**

- Actively reach out
- Build a follow up plan
- Copy & retain documentation

# EMOTIONALLY DISTRESSING BEHAVIOUR

- Evidence to suggest risk of harm to self and others
- Student causing distress for others in the classroom or campus community
- Disrupting the teaching & learning environment



# ACUTE DISTRESSING BEHAVIOUR

- Evidence of harm to self or others
- Disruption affects the safety of teaching
- Disruption affects the safety of the learning environment
